## 2021 Legislative Report

The Legislature passed a bipartisan budget that reflects the values of our communities. The new budget:

- Funds public safety
- Provides a \$1.2 billion increase in education funding
- Protects access to all-day pre-K for 4,000 preschoolers in Minnesota
- Makes significant investments in affordable child care
- Secures financial support for frontline workers
- Funds the development of more affordable housing
- Cuts taxes for workers & small businesses most impacted by the pandemic
- Funds statewide road & bridge repairs and bus rapid transit



- Invests in public health to help reduce racial disparities in health care
- Makes substantial reforms to sexual assault laws to bring justice to survivors
- Enacts measures to reform policing and increase accountability
- Provides funding to improve training for law enforcement and invests in community violence prevention

There's more work to do to build a better future for all Minnesotans in the 2022 legislative session. That session begins January 31, 2022.
